## CARTOGRAPH ESTATE VINEYARD UPDATE

The wait is finally over: After years of planning and permitting, we're ready to field graft the first two blocks of our estate vineyard replant. It feels good to shift to this new phase; watching rootstock grow isn't very exciting.

This rootstock was planted in the spring of 2020 and will be grafted the first week of June 2021. I could get very nerdy on the topic, but the upshot is that this rootstock (420A) is much more drought-tolerant and will allow us to hang on to our canopy later in the season. That will help us ripen crops in cool seasons. The images below show the last steps before grafting, where we remove the protective carton and trim the canes back to give the crew easy access to the trunk.



We'll have about 1.5 acres of Riesling and the same amount of Pinot noir clone 115. We'll get a tiny bit of fruit next year, but because we really want to focus on building the strength of the roots and trunk to prepare us for success in the future, we'll put vine health ahead of yield — always a smart move.

Here's looking forward to Cartograph Estate Riesling!

## SUMMER SHIPPING SPECIAL

We've partnered with UPS to offer a summer shipping solution. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, we're able to ship next-day air at a significantly reduced rate (shipping a case of wine is about \$70 instead of \$200). UPS picks up the wines from us in a refrigerated truck to ensure that they stay at the correct temperature until they arrive at your location the following morning. If you would like us to ship ground, we'll keep an eye on the weather and ship when we can but it may not be until the fall.

We're busy in the tasting room getting furniture back in place and doing a final deep clean before we open up fully later this month. After spending so much time improvising our way through each change in conditions, it feels good to be going back to something familiar. We're very optimistic about the coming summer. Come see us!
