## FROM THE WINEMAKER REPORTING AND REPLANTING

On the winemaking front, not a lot goes on during these cold winter months. The Pinot is topped up and resting nicely; the whites are basically all prettied up and will get bottled early in

the new year.

However, things are a bit more frenzied elsewhere. The end of the year gets busy as you wrap up those tasks you promised to complete so you can go into the new year organized and set for success. Right? (Serena adds: Don't forget your promise in the last newsletter to get the olive oil labels designed!)



The other big task we're currently organizing is our plan to replant the Cartograph Estate vineyard this year. While the vineyard is healthy for the most part, the replant will help in a couple of ways. First, we'll plant more densely so we can get more fruit per acre without stressing the vines; right now, we have to work really hard to get three tons per acre. Second, we're changing the rootstock to which the vines are grafted, which will boost the drought tolerance of the new vines.

The plan requires us to remove all the vines, the trellis system and the water and technology infrastructure, so we can put new infrastructure in place. This spring, we'll tear out rows 1–28 to prepare for vines that will go in the ground in the spring of 2020. Every choice we make will be one that we live with for

decades, so we have to make sure we get it exactly right on paper before we start digging things up.

We're really excited that the replant will enable us to add Riesling vines to the vineyard, and to increase the quantity of Pinot vines we can plant. We'll have some new clones going in as well. This is a five-year project, so we'll definitely be documenting the process and sharing it with you.

If you're hankering for more information about government reporting, go check out the Report of Wine Premises Operations, TTB F 5120.17, and revel in the minutiae that we have to track just to get a bottle of wine into your hands.
