FROM THE WINEMAKER: HARVEST WRAPUP

It has been tough for me to put this year's harvest into perspective. After last year's terrible smoke from wildfires and the disruption caused by COVID-19, it took me a while to get geared up and sink into this year's harvest ... which was, dare I say, totally normal.

Last year, the rule was that if you weren't actively bringing in fruit, you had to stay away from the winery. It was very disruptive - but I didn't realize the extent to which I had internalized how hard it was until we started gearing up for harvest this year. Everyone needed to mask up, but we could work in the winery again and, more important, we could stay on site working and chatting outdoors with the crew and other winemakers as we navigated harvest and winemaking decisions.

The gloom that had floated overhead for the last year melted away and true joy bubbled up as we got into working with this year's great fruit. We could pursue our craft without natural disaster and the pandemic having to be top of mind. The fires that raged elsewhere in the state this year had no effect on the fruit from the Russian River Valley and Mendocino Ridge. You can imagine our sighs of relief as fruit started hitting the sorting table.

Since we're working with fewer vineyards now and are partway through a replant at our estate vineyard, I made the decision to split lots into smaller fermentations and mix up the winemaking strategies to give myself as many blending options as possible next spring. The Riesling and Rosé are just about through fermenting. Both have lovely aromatics and — even at this early stage — really exciting flavors. The Pinots, which have all been put into barrel, are as varied and pretty as I could have hoped. We're really happy to be going into the holiday season with everything on track for an uneventful winter.

I'm sure I wouldn't have said this going into harvest, but sometimes "normal" is the most beautiful word in the world.

- 2017 Green Ranch Pinot Noir, Mendocino Ridge



IDEAS FOR YOUR HOLIDAY TABLE

We love all the flavors of the Thanksgiving meal, and wanted to share some of our favorite recipes and pairings to inspire you as you plan your menu.

Appetizers

- Crab salad served on an endive leaf, paired with Riesling or Brut Rosé
- · Fingerling potatoes with smoked salmon and avocado, paired with Rosé

· Mushroom-stuffed brie en croute, paired with Pinot noir

Vegetable sides

- · Becca's butternut bisque, paired with a Starscape Vineyard Pinot noir
- · Wild mushroom risotto, paired with a Cartograoh Estate Pinot noir
- Roasted butternut squash salad with warm cider vinaigrette, paired with a Perli Vineyard Pinot noir

Brined turkey, stuffing and gravy

This year, we're pairing our turkey, stuffing and gravy with the 2017 Cartograph Estate Pinot Noir and the 2012 Leonardo Julio Pinot Noir and, of course, we'll have a 2017 Green Ranch Riesling on the table as well.

- · Buttermilk-brined turkey breast
- Ina Garten's sausage and herb stuffing or if we get adventurous we'll make Stuffing biscuits
- . Ina Garten's gravy is our go-to; we adjust the seasonings depending on what we have cooking with the turkey

Dessert

We'll pair these with the 2013 Brut Zero.

- Libby's Pumpkin Pie
- Brie cheesecake is something new that we're trying this year; we'll let you know how it turns out!
