EXPLORING THE CELLAR

Every January we inventory the wines in the cellar and taste through the older vintages to see how they're aging. This year, we've discovered low stock of quite a few wines, so we wanted to tell you about them before we run out.

How long can Pinot age? We believe Cartograph Pinots can typically age for 10 years or more — in fact, we're still enjoying our 2009 vintages. As a Pinot ages, bright red fruit flavors like strawberry, Bing cherry and cranberry ebb, while darker red fruit



flavors like blueberry, blackberry and black cherry emerge along with earthy, mushroomy tones. Some wines get more subtle as they age, while some get bolder. We've noticed that the majority of Cartograph Pinots tend to gain palate weight as they age.

Fewer than 10 cases remain:

- 2017 Starscape Vineyard Pinot Noir 20 cases
- 2017 Cartograph Estate Pinot Noir 18 cases

FROM THE WINEMAKER: WHAT'S UP IN THE WINERY?

I'll just start by saying: 37+ inches of rain so far this season!

That felt good. Happy 2023.

The 2022 Pinots have all been tucked away in the barrel room for a couple of months now, while the Riesling and Rosé took their sweet time finishing their primary fermentation. Each of those last two ferments lasted over 100 days, compared to a typical 14-day ferment for a Pinot.

It all comes down to fermentation temperature and, well, I fermented these lots very cold. They stayed in the low 50s, and as they neared completion, they slowed WAAAY down. I achieved what I wanted in that we preserved some wonderful aromatics and generated a silky texture, but that waiting game was a bit tough.

The slow return to the somewhat normal continues, thank goodness.
